## In-Floor Radiant Heat & Snow Removal Reminders

There have been several questions as to how the in-floor radiant heat works. Following are a few tips:

Hydronic heat works very differently than gas forced air and needs to be addressed accordingly.

When setting your thermostat, it is best to maintain a constant temperature. The heat works optimally when the variance is two degrees or less.

The heat pipes are below the 6 inches of concrete so it takes many hours for the concrete to warm and reach high enough to register the temperature at the thermostat. Therefore, an adjustment in temperature may take 12-24 hours to experience.

When windows are opened and the heat is on, the heat will kick in and continue to warm the apartment for the next 12-24 hours until the temperature rises above the temperature setting on the thermostat.

In other words, the heat that remains in the floor at the time the thermostat "kicks off", will continue to rise and warm the apartment.

**Set your thermostat to 70 degrees and wait 2 days. You can then go up or down a degree or two.**

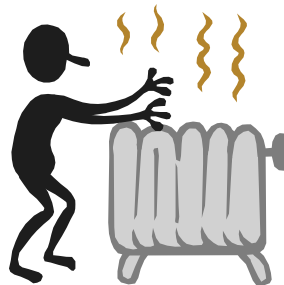
Once your perfect temperature is reached you can just leave it. The beauty of the in floor radiant heat is that it is even and consistent.

**And now a word about snow removal:** Remove your outdoor welcome mat from outside your door so the snow blowers don't tear it up. Our snow removal crew shovel the walkways all the way to your front door. We will not be responsible for any damaged or missing doormats.

Try to park your cars in the garage so you don't have to move them for

the snow plow. If you need to move your vehicle you can park it at a location nearby that has already been plowed. This may seem like a hassle, but it is not our responsibility to dig your car out of 8 inches of snow.

Please understand that The Windsor is a large complex and our snow removal crew works as fast as they can. We want to thank you in advance for your patience while we put forth our best efforts.
